Bob Blumer has always taken an unconventional approach to foodieism, so having the cookbook author and TV personality design a hotel room doesn't seem like such a stretch — especially once you see the room.

"They gave me carte blanche," The Canadian-born Blumer said on the phone Friday from the Surreal Gourner Room at Toronto's Gladstone Hotel. "So I designed something that would appeal to me, with the hope that it would always appeal to someone who would stay in it."



The room's decor, located in room 403 and one of the Gladstone's 37 artist-designed suites, is a pop-art influenced collection of food imagery, from its caviar tin wall clock and marshmallow bag pillowcases to photos of famous food mascots shot by photographer Fausta Facciponte.

"If you look through my cookbooks, there is a particular style that I gravitate towards," Blumer, who illustrates his own work, explained of the room's bright colours and vivid shapes. "My home in Los Angeles is not that different from the feel of this room."
